

Accessible and Affordable Hoosier Travel

Traveling with a family member with special health care needs requires additional planning and preparation to minimize stress and challenges. It is important to remember that travel requires a degree of flexibility. Contacting attractions and vendors, such as hotels and transportation providers, prior to travel to discuss an individual's needs and available accommodations is recommended. Indiana offers residents and other travelers a variety of travel options and services.

Access Pass

Several attractions across the state of Indiana have joined forces to offer an Access Pass, which offers families who are currently receiving assistance the opportunity to take advantage of cultural offerings. The Access Pass offers visitors \$2 general admission per family member per visit. To qualify for an Access Pass, families must participate in one of the following state assistance programs:

- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Food Stamps (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program/SNAP)
- Hoosier Healthwise Insurance

To apply for a pass, visit any of the participating venues and show an Indiana-issued photo ID and proof of state assistance (confirm necessary documentation prior to arrival). Access Passes are renewable annually. Read the complete Access Pass policy [here](#).

Many venues have accessibility guides and will provide services in addition to those listed to ensure an enjoyable experience.

Indiana Department of Natural Resources (DNR) maintains a multitude of state parks, recreation and wilderness areas, forests, preserves, and others. Indiana residents who are at least 65 years of age or are a resident eligible for Social Security disability

payments under 42 USC 401 may be entitled to a Golden Hoosier Passport, which offers a 50% discount on annual entrance pass fees. Proof of eligibility must be presented at time of purchase and the disabled individual must be present in the vehicle at time of use. The Golden Hoosier Passport is not valid at Indiana Historic Sites that charge an entrance fee.
